We did invest in a cultipacker this past fall and we we're way under the amount specified by the club. Bob Thomas has been using it and it has performed very well.

Please note the spur trail to PDQ is a little different this season due to the new concrete sidewalk. We have marked the trail to enter PDQ's parking lot near the vehicle entrance on the north side of their berm. Please watch out for vehicle traffic as well as staying on the trail and off of the berm plus the side walk.

REMEMBER, trails officially open on December 15 given the following conditions are met: at least 6" of snow and 32 degrees Fahrenheit. If by chance, we get enough snow and these conditions are met, please call the snow phones or check out the website for trail conditions before riding. We need to follow these simple rules in order to keep our trails open plus keep our landowners happy.

Now that it is cold and there is snow on the ground, we are ready to hit the trails with our Tucker. Both front tracks have new rubber belting and the bearings have

been repacked. The rear tracks have been inspected and one rubber belt and cleat were replaced due to wear and tear. Bearings in the rear were also gone thru and repacked. We have also installed the rear wiper motor, arm, and wiper, plus we are replacing the rear defogger in the rear window, too.

As this is being mailed, we are also working on the drag to make it more visible. Dave Pom has two flashing red LED lights for the rear of the drag so when crossing roads or when you come up on the groomer, you won't be able to miss it.

Thanks to Randy Kison, Brian Kison, John Haen, Dave Pom and anyone else that has helped this fall on our Tucker repairs. Volunteers are always hard to find, but we keep finding them and are thankful, too.
