#### **GUEST SPEAKER**

We have invited the Cedarburg Fire and Rescue to stop by our December's Club meeting to go over safety issues that are a concern to us as snowmobilers and individuals during the cold and wintery months. They will probably cover the list of items that you should carry with you in case of an emergency as well as what to do when you come across an accident. And, last year they volunteered to set us up with a First Aid bag to carry in the Tucker and we took receipt of this at November's Club meeting. Thanks goes out Dennis Guttmann for following up on this and Theresa Grube for putting the First Aide bag together.

Along the line of safety and snowmobiling, Dennis will be showing us a DVD following Theresa's presentation; it is from the DNR that has footage of some of the fatal snowmobiling accidents and what went wrong. This DVD is also shown this season at the snowmobile safety courses per a directive of the DNR. Stop in and check it out with us.

#### **TRAIL WORK**

Since early October, we have spent quite a few Saturdays brushing, cultimulching and signing our trails getting them ready for our snowmobiling season. We even had one Saturday where it was raining cats and dogs, yet we had a four or five die-hard guys show up and worked at signing part of the trails as well as chunking up a large tree that dropped across our trail.

As for cultimulching this season, we took up Dave Quevy's offer (the son of former Club member Ken Quevy) to help us out. He was able to start on the north end (Snow Drifter's trail) and work his way down Hwy I and then over towards the Kison Farm. So at this time, most of the fields that have been plowed up have been cultimulched. Unfortunately, we do have some that have corn stalks still standing, yet when we groom, we'll make use of our plow blade to flatten the stalks. Otherwise, there are a number of fields with winter wheat in which we need to tread lightly in order not to damage the crops. We have signed them accordingly to inform all snowmobilers of this crop that is under the snow.

Now that December has hit, we have some signing to wrap up as well as three bridges to finish repairing. Those bridges we plan on finishing up on Saturday, December 12<sup>th</sup> given the areas dry out so we are able to get to them. We will be looking for a good crew of volunteers to help with these tasks.
