### WHAT SEASON IS THIS?

This will help any last minute trips going north with good snow covered trails. One can only hope and pray that the snow will follow through with the predictions.

So back to reality with our dismal brown views outside of our windows, I started to think back to February's Club meeting where someone asked "when was the last time we didn't groom at all during a season?". So I decided to dig through our Club's trail maintenance and grooming records and discovered it was less than ten years ago. It was during the 2002-2003 season when this last happened. I had thought it was ten to twelve years ago, yet I was off by a little bit; go figure. Looking back, we have had exceptional snow the last couple of years and have gotten our money's worth out of our Tucker in terms of performance and reliability as well as smooth trails. Given our grooming season is a bust here in our area, we still have been able to put in our trails, re-deck a bridge and remove trails while getting reimbursed from the DNR through our county. So we do have income from this and that has helped carry us heading towards spring and summer as well as the Ozaukee County Fair. At this point, if you find snow and the trails are open, jump on your sled before the white stuff melts.

## February's Sno-Fari

The last weekend in February had our first Sno-Fari. Two couples arrived in Wetmore/Munising on Friday around one pm and went out for a ride. They left Wetmore and went to the Bear Trap (heading east) for a late lunch and then headed south to Seney and to fuel up for the day. Following the fuel stop, they went to Grand Marais for diner at a micro brewery called Lake Superior Brewery. At the end of the day, they rode a total of 150 miles. These trails had enough snow cover but a few sections were beat up, yet were good on the ride home because they started grooming.

Saturday found them riding a total of 237 miles. First, they headed west from Wetmore to Ishpeming and continued to head west until Republic. Then they went south and did a big loop to Gwinn and then headed north then over to Christmas for dinner at Foggy's. Overall, the trails all to the west were great compared to the rest.

One quick note from these riders, if you're looking to hit the trails one last time, head up to this area of the UP. Conditions were very good to excellent and the snowmobile traffic was very light. At most, they saw three dozen snowmobiles over the three days. East and west of Munising was good, yet south of Seney wasn't. Plus, other sledders had mentioned not to go to Marquette, yet south and west of here was much better. Bottom line, snow is forecast for the UP and March is just starting, so if you're on the bubble, pop it and head to the UP.
