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CLUB MEETING – OCTOBER 11TH AT CIRCLE B

FALL means MAINTENANCE & SUCH...

October will be here by the time you receive this newsletter. A very colorful season here in Wisconsin, with trees turning colors plus hunting seasons have opened and blaze orange and camouflage will be the color of choice as well. This means trail work will be right around the corner. From contacting landowners to brushing and installing trail markers, we plan to complete this before the snow flies. We also have started trail work; landowners will be contacted within the next couple of weeks. There may be some new landowners that we will need to meet with so we can go over what are club is about and how the trails work. If you as a landowner have moved or sold your land that our trail crosses, please give us a call and let us know who the new owners are so we can contact them.

We have also started working on our Tucker where we are replacing all the belting for the front tracks. When we purchased our Tucker, we replaced the rubber belting on the both rear tracks and have not had an issue with those. The front tracks have been pieced together over the years and we have had some problems. The new belting will ensure reliability and help keep our Tucker up and running. Also, we plan to grease and repack the bearings and under carriage while we have it blocked up and the tracks off of it. We are also adding an additional pintel hitch right above the existing one. Our existing one snapped last year in the woods and we had to pull out our drag and leave it in the field while we ran the groomer back and welded up the hitch. That Tucker really moves when you're not pulling the drag. The guys went past a couple of sleds that were parked on the side of the trail and you would have they would have gotten whiplash when our Tucker flew past them. Running it like this also helped clean out the carbon.

This about does it for me for this month. By this time next month, Thanksgiving will be a couple of weeks away and after that, snow!!!

Till next month, keep your track in the snow and I'll see you on the trails.
