We are currently looking for a hydraulic cylinder for our cultumulcher; we had one, yet it got scraped when our old cultumulcher was stolen a few years back. This cylinder is needed for raising up the wheels when we cultumulch the farm field where our trails cross. The results are a more level trail allowing for a better trail riding experience and less abuse on our grooming equipment.
