If you weren't at our November's Club meeting, we were experiencing an issue with the steering on our Tucker. There was a leak in the unit in the cab and Randy replaced a seal which stopped the leak. Unfortunately, when all was reconnected, something caused the steering to pulsate and jerk the steering wheel back and forth which could easily cause harm to you if you were grabbing onto the wheel to steer. Since this time, we ordered and have received a new hydraulic pump (exact match to our old one) and once all the hoses were connected in the right sequence, our Groomer was steering just like old times! What was a pain in Randy's derriere (after he fixed the leak in the steering unit in the cab) was actually the hydraulic pump going bad (better to find this now than in the woods). The lines to the steering were wide open and received all the pressure (approximately 2000psi); the new pump is delivering the correct pressure and functioning perfectly. Thanks, Randy, for taking the time to get this issue resolved and our Tucker back up and ready for the trails!!
