PINK RIBBON RIDERS

Lisa Hansen of the above group will be joining us at our December's Club meeting to give us an overview on how her group operates and how they raise money to help women and men fighting breast cancer. Here is a brief splash on them: Pink Ribbon Riders is a non profit (last year PRR was 84% to the cause) volunteer based organization that raises funds for both men and women breast cancer patients in need. The PRR Assistance Program is made available to patients that reside in the states in which the Snow Runs are held in. The 2017 Snow Run Tour includes Michigan, New York, Minnesota, Wyoming and Wisconsin (January 27-28 at Wild Eagle Lodge, Eagle River). The Snow Runs begin with a social gathering on Friday night, the ride on Saturday and Dinner Banquet afterwards - So much fun and we always get to meet new people!

Patients are able to apply to the program on-line through the PRR website. Patients that qualify receive a \$500 financial gift that they can use toward medical bills, gas money, or any financial need while fighting the disease. PRR receives on average 5-7 patients applying per day, 7 days a week! To date, PRR has distributed \$1.5 Million in gifts to patients since 2007.

Lisa will have raffles tickets to sell at \$20 each for a new Polaris snowmobile; otherwise, she will be accepting cash donations as well. Let's show her our support!
