What Rudy just mentioned was never recorded and would not have been known without Rudy's help. Now, that following December, our club held its first club meeting and in January, our club was incorporated.

Another interesting detail from Rudy is the origin of the Black and Blue newsletter. It turns out that his wife, Carol, was the brainchild as well as editor and writer, of our newsletter. She got the idea (now don't get ahead of me) from how you felt after riding as well as racing those early snowmobiles – black and blue. Pretty fitting.

## TRAILS

Once again, we have snow and the trails have been opened for some time. Please remember to call the snow phones for both counties (Ozaukee & Washington) before riding to make sure they are open. Plus, use good judgment as well and follow these two criteria before riding: 32 degrees F or lower and at least 6" of snow on the ground. We have found that the Ozaukee County snow phone has not been updated very well and the trails are open but then snow is very sparse at some places. So please be responsible snowmobilers and help us keep our trails.

Also, we had an incident with a club member and a landowner during the last weekend of January. No one was hurt or land or crops damaged, but this situation should not have happened. Bottom line is we need to stay on the marked snowmobile trail. That is where we have been given permission to ride and riding outside the marked trail jeopardizes our trails and the relationship we have with our landowners. We lose enough trails to development; we don't need to hurt ourselves.

There is also an area on the west end where snowmobilers have gone off the trail and created a racetrack. Unfortunately, that field contains winter wheat (which has been marked again with signs) and we will be liable for any damage that occurred. Once again, snowmobiling off the trail will hurt our sport and us. Please stay on the marked trail.
