## *THE FAIR IS APPROACHING...*

Yes, it is past half way in July and the Ozaukee County Fair starts in less than two weeks from when you receive this newsletter. The importance to this fair is that it holds our annual fund raiser, which is our food and beer tent and we're located on the north end of the Ozaukee County Fair Grounds. And we need you, our volunteers, to help us man the bar and cook shack to help make this another profitable fund raiser.

Once again, our Club will be joined with members from the Snow Drifters and the Snow Seekers, to help out this year in the kitchen and bar. But we still fall short in many areas on the schedule – please see the “HELP NEEDED” areas. As I'm writing this and looking over the schedule, **we need help (if you can come in earlier, stay later, or work another shift, please do so): Wednesday 2pm to 5pm, Thursday 10am to 4pm, Friday Kitchen 10am to 2pm, Saturday Bar 9am to 4pm, and Sunday 9am to 6pm. We do need extra help covering lunch and dinner hours on Friday and Saturday;** dinner rush starts early so be there by 4pm. Plan to **arrive at least 15 minutes before your shift** so you can re-refresh yourself with the procedures and learn the new information. As usual on Sunday (August 7) and Monday (August 8), **we need help for Teardown (which starts around 6pm).** The bar is taken down and the cook shack is emptied on Sunday with the cook shack being washed and taken down on Monday.

If for any reason you cannot work when you have volunteered, please call Chris Habich at 262-352-6992 to inform her of this change. Also, please do not bring your children to help unless they are 18 or older (insurance reasons and state health codes), plus no cell phone use or smoking behind the bar (this causes distractions).

Remember, for those volunteering to work, there are many other jobs besides cooking, food preparing and bartending. We will need help slicing buns, stocking the kitchen, stocking the soda & beer coolers, wiping down tables and the bar, washing dishes, separating burgers, and other odd jobs. There is plenty to do; just ask if you're not sure what to do next. Also, remember to sign in and out on the time sheets; they are located by the cash box.

Closing shift – if you are signed up to work until close, please stay thru closing because we need help cleaning up. If we are over staffed, the licensed bartender will let you know if you are able to leave early.

Bartenders – please remember “You Must Card” anyone that doesn't look at least 30 years old. Individuals must be 21 on or before this day, 1990, to buy beer, Mike's Hard Lemonade, Wine Coolers, and Sharps. No I.D., no alcohol; also, we only accept Wisconsin I.D.s. It may seem a hassle to ask for I.D., but it is better to be safe than serving an underage person.

Last but not least, we will have entertainment again this year. Wednesday night will feature a live band and Rod Otto with 401(k)araoke will be planning music Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights plus Sunday afternoon.

Thank you to all the volunteers working extra hours for our one and only fund raiser. Without the volunteer efforts throughout the year, our club would not survive as ours has. Thank you for your support!!!

Once again, I have used up my allotted space and need to wrap it up (and I flowed over to the second page). So, till next month, keep your track on the snow and remember, "United We Trail, Divided We Fail".....

## **NOTES FROM THE NESCO QUEEN**

Most prices have remained the same from last year's fair, yet please make sure you are charging the customer the right price (menu pads have the correct prices on them). All sandwiches will come with pickles unless marked plain (no charge); onions and kraut are also free. However, a customer can order extra cheese, tomato or lettuce for \$0.50 extra each. Example, a brat with cheese, add \$0.50; a brat with cheese, tomato and lettuce, add \$1.50 extra to the price of the brat. And last but not least, a burger with the works is our Sno-Burger (\$4.00), which is similar to a Big Mac.

Two other items to be careful with, the rib-eye sandwich is made to order. We do not cook them ahead of time and they take approximately four (4) minutes to cook. This keeps them fresh and just right. Also, this is the first year we are attempting french fries. These also take four (4) minutes to cook and we will make them to order as well. There are two choices of fries – regular fries (sea salt) or seasoned fries (Lawry's Seasoned Salt). Both are the same price of \$3.00 each.

If you have any questions with the menu pad or items on the menu or even how to correctly fill out an order, please ask. This will cut down on the confusion in the kitchen when they prepare your order. Please remember, we're all volunteers so be patient with us.

As always, you will receive a free Club t-shirt, a beverage of your choice and sandwich for working a minimum of four hours. Unfortunately, the rib-eye sandwich or french fries are not part of the free sandwich due to their cost. You are still welcome to purchase them if you want them. Remember, this is our one and only fund-raiser; please help us out by keeping the honor system honest.

Thank you for volunteering to help staff our food and beer tent. We have a great crew and are still 100% volunteer!! This is something to be proud of as we embark on another County Fair. Let's have a great time and make another good profit to help keep our Club grooming this upcoming season.
