The Fair came and went....

Since we talked last, our one and only fund raiser has come and gone. And we have had another successful year thanks to all of our volunteers. Forty years of continued volunteer help by our members has kept us on the trails. As in the past, thanks to our volunteers, we have had another profitable fair. We did have an interesting start to our setup for the fair due to Hwy. I being under construction. The construction had us bring down our bar and cook shack thru Saukville a week earlier and stage it at Putz's Uncle's place. (At that time, I also found out that my brake lights on my van didn't work and it wasn't the bulbs being burned out.) This actually worked out very well and made getting our equipment over to the fair grounds quicker for setup. Otherwise, setup went on without any problems.

Our cook shack got another addition thanks to the carpentry and sheet metal skills of Mike Mueller. The east wall surrounding the grill was extended to the south so we could add another grill to help out during the heavy demand times. We had on loan from Ozaukee Hardware, a New Holland Grill, which is a convection style grill. This was a different way to cook brats, but the brats didn't flair up and kept our regular grill open for burgers.

There were two issues we had to deal with during the first two nights of the fair. On Wednesday night, we lost power for approximately 45 minutes. We were told that the north side of Cedarburg was without power and this included the fair grounds. Fortunately for us, our cooks kept the gas grills going and the heat in the nescos kept the food at the right temperature so we could still sell food. And the beer kept flowing as well, too. According to one of our patrons, the reason we could still pour beer without power, "was that the beer flowed by gravity".

One other issue that hit us was the CO2 used to dispense the beer from the 1/2 barrels ran out on Thursday night sometime around 8:00pm. To get another CO2 cylinder, we had to get a hold of WOW Distributing, our Miller Rep. This took about an hour and in the mean time, we did what we had to sell beer. It might not have been MGD or Lite, but we still sold beer.

All in all, we had a very good fair, including having music all five days. It was the first time in a long time we had a live band under our tent. Whether this added to our bottom line or not, it's hard to tell. But we all had fun and made money doing it. We're good for another season.
