All in all, we went through all most 400 brats (had only eight party packs left), close to 1000 pounds of hamburgers (about 3000 burgers), all the soda except a few cases, sixty ½ barrels of Miller products and twenty-seven cases of Bud product. For a local fair, we did very well this past summer.
