IT'S A MYSTERY

We have a little bit of a mystery on our hands and we need your help in solving it. I've asked around to a few members and no one has an idea of what happened. Here is the mystery: on our trail going west behind Galimoto's Twelve21 and heading towards the woods, we use five-gallon buckets filled with gravel to hold our stakes with trail signs as we've been asked not to pound them into the ground due to the clay cap. This past fall, I went back there to brush our trail and found that all of our trail signs were removed from the stakes, yet all the buckets with stakes were still in place along our trail. I did bring this up to some of our trail workers this fall and all were surprised as I was with what I had seen.

Normally, we'll just pull the buckets with the stakes and signs and leave them by the gate on east end by the asphalt road, unless it is too muddy to get back there. It isn't a big deal especially if all the signs are in our sign shed (we're trying to account for them), and if so, we would like to thank the Club member for helping out with trails last spring. Unfortunately, no one that I've talked to knows where the trail markers ended up, including the former landowner. If anyone has information on this, please let Randy Kison or myself know. We're just looking to solve our mystery, just like the Scooby-Doo, Shaggy and the kids in the Mystery Machine!
