We invited Lisa Stahl to our December's Club meeting to discuss the Pink Ribbon Riders, a non-profit group that Lisa belongs to and is very passionate. Last year, we raised over \$500; this year, between the 50/50 raffle, raffle tickets and with our Club's match (we were to match up to \$250 given our members donated that much and we did!!). EQUIPMENT

Back in fall, we purchased a set of cross-country ski patterns as well as a set of pizza cutters that are designed for our Arrowhead Drag. The pizza cutters are round metal discs on a spring loaded arm designed to keep our drag from sliding sideways on an incline or fish-tailing on icy surfaces, which will give our operators better control of the drag. The cross-country ski patterns are for making two tracks each (we have two sets) for the cross-country ski trails in the Pleasant Valley Park. This will give cross-country skiers a better and more useable trail thru the park.

Because these items won't attach themselves to our drag, we need to thank the following for getting them welded to our drag: Jake Bublitz, Evan Fischer, Alex Salkowski, Randy Kison, and Peewee. Thanks guys for your hard work on this project!!

TRAIL WORK

Trails are all in and ready to go, just in case we get snow! Our Club did vote to invest in two Milwaukee 18Volt DC tools to help with trail installation and brushing at our last Club meeting. One was a concrete hammer drill which we use to put 1-1/2" holes into the frozen tundra of Ozaukee County to help install our signs when we encounter frost (which we have for the last four falls). Also purchased was a Milwaukee 18V DC chainsaw, which will be ideal when grooming as you can keep it in the cab and not have to worry about a hot and smelly gas powered chainsaw. Both have been used and very well received!

Also with trails, we have had some land change hands and we're in the process of getting in touch with our new landowners. This sometimes an easy task, yet at other times, it takes a while. So before the snow really starts to fall, we will work diligently to get permission from our new landowners to help keep our trails intact.

Remember, we need at least 8" of snow on the open fields as well as 32 degrees or colder for us or any county to open their snowmobile trails.
