# A Grateful Brushing Crew – Matt Geszvain

I had the privilege of operating the new ATV couple to the new brusher on Saturday October 21st and was more than impressed. The combination made this arduous task easy and gave results better than imagined. Here is what I experienced. I will start with the ATV. The smooth power has more than enough to move the new brusher. When we mow, we operate it in 4WD low. It handles it with ease. Pulling up on top of 5-6' grass with ease and bringing the mower right behind it. Going about 2 MPH seems to be a sweet spot when it tall grass.

(Brushing cont'd) The best feature is the one I considered least when looking at the ATV is the Power Steering. It makes all the difference. It makes it super easy to have one handed operation in the thickest brush. It also reduces operator fatigue tremendously. I used it from 8:30-3:30 and could have gone longer if needed. The mower is awesome too. I was on the Mower Task Force and was adamant about getting a flail type mower. I was used to the results we had with our old rotary mower and was looking for a different option. As you know we went with a two-blade rotary mower. I was a little skeptical, but when I saw the unit, I was impressed by its rugged quality and thick steel where it counts. When I operated it, I was so glad that it got the same results as the flail type mowers, maybe even better. We found that it mulches very well. We used a pole hedge trimmer to cut small brush and left the less than 1" branches in the trail. One pass over with the mower and it disappeared. Awesome.

There are a couple of things that we can use to make it our own like a chain saw mount and hand guards. Cruise control would be awesome if there is such a thing. Overall, it is awesome. I just wanted to thank everyone in the club and all its sponsors for the ability for us to purchase such a combination. It makes a tough task fun and will give awesome results. This will be one more reason for everyone to say the we have the best trails around. Thanks to all and think snow!
